Creating safe spaces and identifying the right staff

- Where to you meet teens?
- Bellefaire's model- We are a virtual shelter. We meet you where you are at.
- Assess for safety at all times
- Work in collaboration with police, community partners, families, neighbors, and the teens identified support system.

Assessment towards engagement

- Where do you stay?
- Who do you stay with?
- No where do you live? Who are your mom and dad? These are not givens for our teens.
- How can I help?
- What do you need to succeed?
- Assess the youth's stage in the process of change?
- Always assessing for safety and immediate needs.
- Do you have a key where you stay?

What is sex trafficking?

- Human trafficking is the business of stealing freedom for profit.
- In some cases, traffickers trick, defraud or physically force victims into providing commercial sex.
- In others, victims are lied to, assaulted, threatened or manipulated into working under inhumane, illegal or otherwise unacceptable conditions. (Polaris Project)

Human/Sex Trafficking - Warning Signs for Minors

Appearance

- Does the youth exhibit signs of physical and/or sexual abuse?
 Are there bruises on the face?
- Do you notice a new hair style, wig, or polished nails knowing that the youth does not have funds for these services?
- Is there a new tattoo on the back of the neck or wrist?

Human/Sex Trafficking - Warning Signs for Minors 2

Behavior

- Is the youth running away to unknown places and for unknown reasons?
- Do you notice a pattern in the time of day the youth goes missing?
- Is the youth away or working excessively long and/or unusual hours?
- Is the youth unpaid, paid very little, or paid in return for food, clothing, and housing?
- Has the youth been promised unrealistic opportunities like a modelling career?
- Is the youth unable or unwilling to identify the name of an employer or person picking them up from your home?
- Is the youth saying they are working but you do not see a paycheck?
- Is the youth not sure of their residence or appear confused about where they stay?

Human/Sex Trafficking - Warning Signs for Minors 3

Presentation

- Does the youth present with a heightened sense of fear and anxiety?
- Is the youth depressed, submissive, tense, nervous, and/or paranoid?
- Does the youth refuse to make eye contact?
- Does the youth feel hopeless and out of control?
- Is the youth at risk of self-harm due to increased hopelessness and/or feeling trapped?
- Does the youth have numerous inconsistences in his/her story?
- Does the youth lack access to health care?

Mental health

- Trust- some victims, the trauma induced by someone they once trusted results in pervasive mistrust of others and their motives.
- Trauma Bond from the offender/pimp is trauma-coerced bonding or a trauma-coerced attachment. Until we find a healthy replacement such as reunited with family and decreased stressors.
- The attachment is marked by a shift in internal reality, whereby the victim begins to lose her sense of self, adopts the worldview of the abuser, and takes responsibility for the abuse
- Victims of human trafficking may suffer from anxiety, panic disorder, major depression, substance abuse, and eating disorders as well as a combination of these.
- Be aware of our mental health as well. Professionals including law enforcement are exposed to secondary trauma

Key characteristics of a skilled provider working with trauma-survivors

- Understands that certain survivor behaviors are a response to trauma;
- Is knowledgeable regarding the mental health [and substance abuse] effects of violence and in particular, sexual violence;
- Is skilled and knowledgeable regarding trauma and trauma treatment;
- Is able to provide culturally competent services and seeks supervision regarding cultural issues;
- Is responsive to emergency mental health issues of clients

- Trauma can significantly affect how an individual functions. Research shows trauma disrupts the central nervous system and overwhelms a person's ability to cope. It often results in feeling vulnerable, helpless, and afraid. It interferes with relationships and fundamental beliefs about oneself, others, and one's place in the world.

SAFETY

- Staff encourages and assists clients in creating wellness plans that protect against crisis & relapse.
- Staff creates a welcoming and inviting space for clients to relax, be comfortable, and engage in services.
- Staff is committed to the well-being and success of the clients.

TRUSTWORTHINESS

- Staff is respectful, clear, and consistent with expectations and interactions with clients.
- Staff speaks about clients with respect and acceptance.
- Staff includes clients in designing and improving services by using tools such as satisfaction surveys & consumer advisory boards.

CHOICE

• Staff works with clients to develop individualized recovery plans that promote opportunities for personal development.

COLLABORATION

• There are systematic ways for clients to give feedback to staff regarding TIC values (i.e., safety, trustworthiness, choice, collaboration and empowerment).

EMPOWERMENT

• Staff supports the time commitment necessary for clients to make changes in long-held habits and coping strategies.


